Updates:

• 2022 Special Events: Skippack Township is thrilled to bring special events back to the township this year. Street Lighting Upgrade Project:

The Township is one of several municipalities currently working with a consultant through the Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission's Regional Street Lighting Procurement Program. Under the program, a consultant is evaluating our existing street lighting system and will make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors on upgrading our lights with new energy-efficient LED lights. The upgraded LED lights would reduce energy consumption and cost by 50-75% and would improve the lighting performance of our street lighting. • 2022 Road Improvement Project: In 2022, the Township will be completing road paving and drainage improvements on Evansburg Road from Skippack Pike to Kratz Road and Collegeville Road from Meetinghouse Road to Landis Road.

• Board of Supervisors Meetings: Please join us at our monthly meetings either in-person or view the livestream on our YouTube Channel. They are scheduled for May 11th, June 8th, July 13th, and August 10th. We love hearing from residents and working with community members to make Skippack Township the best place to live and work.

Tax Collector Update

FROM THE TAX CORNER:

As I enter my 22nd year as Tax Collector, I am honored to serve Skippack Township for another 4-year term. I thank you for your support and for re -electing me in the 2021 election.

As a reminder, each year Real Estate Tax Bills are mailed as follows:

- Montgomery County/Skippack Township Real Estate Tax Bill mailed on March 1st
- 2% discount is due by April 30th or the face amount due by June 30th.
- The Perkiomen Valley School Real Estate Tax Bill mailed on July 1st
- Due dates to be announced by the Perkiomen Valley School Board

Community & Land Development Updates

Mill Run (Former Perkiomen Valley Airport) – The Township received an application for a residential subdivision on the former Perkiomen Valley Airport property. The plan calls for 58 single-family homes and over half of the property being preserved as open space. Of the almost 29 acres of open space, 16.5 acres at the corner of Collegeville and Landis Roads will be an active recreational area. The project has been reviewed once before the Planning Commission and will be reviewed again before it is presented to the Board of Supervisors.



- **Pennsylvania State Police Barracks and Training Center** Construction on the new Pennsylvania State Police Barracks and Training Center is moving quickly. The new headquarters building is nearly complete and the State Police should be moving in late spring or early summer. The Training Center is right behind and construction is projected to be completed by the end of the year.
- **Dunkin Donuts** 4124 Skippack Pike (Former Gas Station Property) The applicant is working with PennDOT and the Township's Traffic Engineer on the traffic plans for the project. The project will be appearing at the Planning Commission once they have the plans finalized. Once it is reviewed by the Planning Commission, the project will appear before the Board of Supervisors for their review.
- **1052 Bridge Road (Former Cork's General Store)** An application was received for a townhouse project on the former Cork's General Store property. The plan calls for 6 townhouses and a parking area along Bridge Road. The project has received conditional use approval and the land development application is under review. The project will be reviewed by the Planning Commission in April and then it will be presented to the Board of Supervisors in May.

Retrievr Collects Clothes, Electronics & Household Items

Retrievr, the pickup service for electronics and clothing recycling that serves Montgomery County, has added to the list of materials that it will accept for a fee. Microwave ovens, dehumidifiers, air conditioners, and mini refrigerators can be picked up for a fee, in addition to TVs and monitors. Also, Retrievr has resumed a buyback program for high value items like smartphones and branded clothing. The fee schedule is listed below and is on the Retrievr website at http://retrievr.com/montcopa.

There is now an added \$10 flat doorstep convenience fee for clothing and any small electronics. If any of the below items are included with the pickup, the doorstep convenience fee is waived.

Fees are charged for the following items:

• \$10 for each microwave • \$35 for each TV under 150 lbs. and monitors that use a Cathode Ray Tube (CRT)

• \$100 for each TV 150 lbs. or more, such as those with wooden cabinets or rear-projection TVs

• \$50 for each dehumidifier, window air-conditioner and mini refrigerator under 50 lbs.

Retrievr will also pick up the following electronic devices: computers, cell phones, hard drives, keyboards, mice, PC speakers, PC power supplies, printers, fax machines, stereo equipment, TVs, VCRs, CD players, and laptop and cell phone batteries

In addition to electronics, Retrievr will pick up the following:

- Clothing All men's, women's, children's, and infant clothing including shirts, pants, shorts, dresses, skirts, blouses, sweaters, jackets, raincoats, overcoats, outerwear, sleepwear, swimsuits, T-shirts, undergarments, and formal wear.
- Footwear shoes, boots, sandals, heels, slippers. Accessories: belts, hats, scarves, jewelry, ties, gloves, handbags,
- Bedding comforter, sheets, pillow cases and blankets.
- **Household items** curtains/draperies, Halloween costumes, cloth napkins, table cloths, towels.

When does the program go into effect?

Right now! Simply visit <u>retrievr.com</u> or text the word PICKUP to 757-70-FETCH (757-703-3824) and follow the guided scheduler to set a date.

What if I can't send text messages?

Call our number and leave a voicemail. Someone will contact you to schedule a pickup.

What items do you accept?

Visit retrievr for a full list of accepted items.

Where should I leave my items?

You can leave your items on your porch, just outside your door, or just outside your garage.

What if I have items I don't want to leave outside, is that okay?

Yes! You might prefer to keep items like computers, phones, or tablets indoors until the driver arrives. When you schedule your pickup, you can ask **retrievr** to ring your bell when they arrive.

Can I get a tax write off for items collected?

No. Just as your recycled paper, bottles and cans are not tax deductible, neither are recycled clothing and electronics.

Fire Safety for Your Home:

Sadly, early 2022 saw two disastrous fires just days apart, both with numerous fatalities. The first was close to home in Philadelphia and the second was in New York City. These events were somber reminders of the steps we should all take, both to prevent fires from occurring and to safely escape with our families if they do.

- Smoke detectors have been shown to save lives during fires. They give you an early warning so you and your family can escape. They should be placed on every level and inside and outside of each sleeping area. Test them monthly and replace them every 10 years. If anyone hard of hearing lives in your home you should get a special alarm with strobe lights and bed shakers.
- Carbon monoxide (CO) is an odorless, colorless and deadly gas. It can become trapped in a home due to faulty heaters, a blocked chimney or if exhaust leaks into a home, such as when generators are used near an attached garage. CO poisoning can result from low doses over an extended period of time or high doses over a short time period. CO detectors also should be tested monthly and should be replaced every 7 years.
- Escape plans can help everyone evacuate safely in an emergency. Families should plan how they can escape

their house during the day and at night. In both cases it can be hard to see during a fire and you will likely need to crawl to stay out of the smoke. Practicing can be fun - draw up a plan as a family, post it on the refrigerator and let the kids stay up late. Establish a meeting area and be sure all members of the household know where it is, whether it is the sidewalk in front of your house, a neighbor's porch, or some other location. To start the drill, activate the smoke detector and crawl out of the house. Close the doors behind you as you leave. Practice this drill often, both day and night, with various family members starting in different areas of the home.

"Close while you doze" is a safety campaign that advocates for closing interior doors to protect people during house fires, both by starving the fire of oxygen and by creating a physical barrier between the flames and sleeping occupants. Even hollow core doors make a big difference: 100°F with low levels of CO for a closed door versus 1000°F with deadly levels of CO for an open door. WHAT TO DO: Lock Up - Don't Share - Safely Dispose

- Lock up all your medications
- Don't share your medications with anyone or take someone else's medications
- Safely dispose of unused or unwanted medications. When you pick up a prescription, ask your pharmacist for drug disposal pouches or find a drug take-back box.

All prescribed medications to be disposed of should be contained inside their original bottle or placed inside a small sealed container (i.e. plastic bottle) or zip-lock bag

• Personal information should be removed or marked out with a permanent marker

- Over-the-counter medications
- Prescription medications
- Prescription patches
- Prescription ointments
- Vitamins
- Pet medicines

Iodine-containing medications

Thermometers

Alcohol & illicit drugs (i.e. marijuana, heroin, LSD, etc.)



Skippack Historical Society

Since 1967, the Skippack Historical Society (SHS) has been researching and preserving our local history. After Philadelphia, the Skippack Valley may have the largest collection of colonial homes in Pennsylvania! George Washington and the Continental Army not only passed through Skippack a few times, but also encamped here prior to their attack on Germantown in 1777. SHS actively keeps alive our local history by preserving two properties in the township. At the Indenhofen Farmstead the group focuses on the early settlement of the township and its role during the American Revolution. Here we host our annual Washington's Encampment living history event in the fall. Our second farmstead, the Skippack Farm Museum, is in the town of Creamery. Former home of the Allebach and Cholet families, this farm keeps alive the memory of Skippack's agricultural past. Here we preserve antique farm equipment and hold an annual Fall Fest in October with hayrides, animals, and antique tractors. If you have an interest in local history, please come join us! 


