SKIPPACK ELEMENTARY SCHOOL FLAG CONTEST

Congratulations to the winners of the first-ever Skippack Elementary School fifth-grade flag contest, Mr. Mungin's class! After their flag design received the most votes on our Facebook page, the Township brought the design to life as a fabric flag. Mr. Mungin's class was honored and presented with their flag at the April 10 Board of Supervisors meeting.

Supervisor Chairman Paul Fox and Vice Chair Nick Fountain proudly carried the new "official" flag of Skippack Township in the 'Parade of Flags' during the Opening Ceremony of the Annual PSATS (Pennsylvania Association of Township Supervisors) Conference held in Hershey on April 15, 2024. These flags will also fly alongside the American Flag at the Township building, Township parks, and at Skippack Elementary School.









PENNDOT 2023 MULTI-MODAL GRANT FUNDING AWARDED

Skippack Township was awarded a 2023 PennDOT Multimodal Transportation Grant for \$182,190 to make pedestrian safety improvements at Cross Road and Spencer Drive. This will help increase walkability in our community and is just another way our Supervisors continue to keep our residents safe. Skippack Township thanks Senator Tracy Pennycuick and Representative Matt Bradford for their support in this endeavor and for attending our April Board of Supervisors meeting to present the grant award.





SKIPPACK EMERGENCY SERVICES PUBLIC MEETING

On January 23, 2024, the Skippack Township Board of Supervisors held a public meeting to discuss financial support and the coverage areas of Skippack EMS and Skippack Fire Company. Representatives from both SEMS and Skippack Fire Co. presented on these topics and responded to questions. The meeting was attended by Senator Pennycuick and Representative Bradford, as well as Montgomery County Commissioner Tom DiBello, representatives from the PA Department of Corrections, Montgomery County Department of Health, and many delegates from neighboring municipalities. The meeting was a productive starting point for discussions involving changes to emergency services in our area and incentives for volunteer participation, such as the Volunteer Earned Income Tax Relief Credit that was announced shortly thereafter.

STEPPINGSTONES AT LENAPE PARK

Our steppingstone project at Lenape Park was completed earlier this year! We partnered with Perkiomen Watershed Conservancy to receive a Montco 2040 grant for this project, which uses poured-in-place concrete "stones" to create a footpath across the East Branch of the Perkiomen Creek. This crossing creates a vital link between the 170 acres of the county-owned Pennypacker Mills and the 34 acres of Lenape Park. Further, it provides a trail connection linking hundreds of residents to the Montgomery County trail system. Come visit Lenape Park this summer and check them out!

SUMMER STORMWATER MANAGEMENT

Summer is here, a time to for relaxing vacations, cookouts with family and friends, and lounging at the beach or by the pool! While the summer months provide us with opportunity recharge our batteries, it's important to remember that even though we go on vacation, stormwater pollution does not!

Heavy rains brought on by summer thunderstorms causes runoff to rush into local waterways, picking up litter, chemicals and other pollutants along the way. Additionally, hot pavement leads to an increase in the temperature of stormwater entering creeks and streams which can be detrimental for aquatic life.

Luckily there are some easy steps that you can take to reduce stormwater pollution on your property this summer!

Water your lawn and garden slowly. Only water your grass and plants when necessary. When watering, do so slowly to reduce runoff. Consider investing in irrigation hoses or gator bags!



Wash your car at a car wash. When you wash your car on your driveway or the street, grease, soap and oil can wash into streams and creeks.



Never dump anything down storm drains. Remember that storm drains empty directly into local waterways without being treated. This means that whatever enters a storm drain will flow into streams and creeks.



Direct downspouts over porous, not paved surfaces. Where possible, direct downspouts into garden beds, your lawn or consider installing a rain barrel.
